#### **Fringe Activities**

For the fourth year, the Fringe Reading Group has continued to bring together members of the academic community at all stages of their careers. For those of you who are not familiar with this group, in our sessions combine classic and contemporary articles and chapters from a variety of perspectives on the urban, including literature and cultural studies, anthropology, sociology, history and architecture. This year we tried a different format, with a 2-day symposium (7 and 8 of March 2024). Our group managed to overcome the challenges of different time zones to engage in lively discussions about subterranean cities, indigenous perspectives on colonial capitals, the urban abject, feral cities, disabilities and loneliness in urban environments. Our readings included texts by David Pike, Coll Thrush, Adèle Nel, Silke Horstkotte and Nancy Pedri, Abida Younas and Kawthar Yasser Al Othman, and Olivia Laing, among others. In September, we will announce the dates for the next reading group symposium.
